As former Executive Director of The Nord Center in Lorain, Ohio, Dr. Spiegelberg provided leadership for the implementation of evidence-based clinical treatment programs including Integrated Dual Diagnosis Treatment, Illness Management & Recovery, Supported Employment, Behavioral Family Therapy, and Dialectical Behavior Therapy and data-based decision-making processes involving consumer outcomes and performance improvement projects. The Nord Center received the Ohio Department of Mental Health Clinical Quality Award in 2005 for their work with best clinical practices, consumer outcomes, and performance improvement initiatives. During her tenure at The Nord Center, Dr. Spiegelberg also served as Director of Clinical Services and Director of Program Evaluation & Outcomes Management. She is a member of the Lorain County Leadership Class of 2002.

Dr. Spiegelberg is a founding member of and currently serves as a consultant to the Wellness Management & Recovery Coordinating Center of Excellence in Columbus, Ohio, which has developed and is disseminating a new best practice psycho-educational program across the state of Ohio. WMR is designed to promote holistic health, empowerment, and recovery for individuals living with serious mental illness.

The Nord Family Foundation is a successor to the charitable trust originally established by Walter G. Nord in 1952. The predecessor organization contributed more than \$12 million to a variety of charitable causes between 1953 and 1988, primarily in Lorain County, Ohio.
